Dear K-12 Education Budget Committee members,

As a parent in the Olathe School District, I ask of you to vote NO on bill HB 2550.

Our public tax dollars should stay with our public schools. Public dollars should fund public education, not private schools. Public schools serve all children, regardless of socioeconomic status or otherwise. Kansas schools have been underfunded for more than a decade.

The legislature should focus on learning recovery due to the pandemic, and meeting the special ed funding requirement.

My son is nonverbal autistic, and his classroom is full of kids that have significant educational needs. These children need adequate funding to succeed, not for tax dollars to be diverted to schools that won't be held accountable by state standards

because they are private institutions. Implementing Education Savings Accounts that divert our tax dollars to private schools will jeopardize the priorities and success of public education.
