SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 319 by Senator Haley


In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 319 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

Under current law, judicial foreclosure tax sales by public auction are held at either the county courthouse or some other location in the county. SB 319 would specify that the “other location” be a “physical” location in the county. The bill would also define “public auction.” The bill would take effect upon its publication in the *Kansas Register*.

The Office of Judicial Administration states enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect on Judicial Branch operations. Any fiscal effect associated with SB 319 is not reflected in *The FY 2023 Governor’s Budget Report*.

The Kansas Association of Counties states enactment of the bill would have a negligible fiscal effect on Kansas counties.
